Remember to keep your eye out for important updates from the Exam Office in your emails.

This year you will be receiving your certificates in a different way. Around the middle of July Ascentis will give us access to your e-certificates which we will check before sending on to you via e-mail. Each certificate will contain a unique QR code which verifies each certificate. This should provide suitable evidence for HE admissions etc. The upload to UCAS via Ascentis will still be at the end of July. This is when your Universities will officially know your results. Because of COVID 19 Ascentis will not be able to send out physical certificates until October when they will be reopening their offices. As soon as we know the date we will be contact all our graduates to tell you when we will be sending them out.

So please make sure the e-mail address listed on your account is correct as this is where we will send your e-certificate to.

New Starter Advice

- Take your time with the SAQs. These help you to consolidate what you have learned in the materials, making the learning process better.

Remember to take a moment to relax...

- Use the shortcut 'Ctrl + f' to help you find key words in documents.
- When completing TAQs, keep looking back at the assessment criteria. This will ensure that your answers will meet all the assessment criteria.
- Ask for help when you are stuck! You can always ask your tutor for help if you need it, that's what they are there for! You can also sometimes find helpful advice on the Facebook groups, as it is likely that other students will have had the same issue.
- Always have your goal in mind. If you are starting to lose motivation try to remember why you started in the first place. Think about how far you have gotten and what it will mean when you have finished.

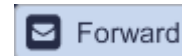


Applying to university next year?
