Sharon was one of three students who went out Rwanda to do research on infection rates, 'information share' in the local polytechnic and develop a sepsis screening tool based on the QSOFA theory for use in the hospital. Their work was well received and the hospital now uses the tool on many of their wards and there is a possibility of tool being used in 12 local health centres. After a further placement this summer, Sharon has her heart set on a career in A&E and maybe one day going on to do her advanced practitioner course.

Phil's interest in prehospital care has led him to specialise in areas he enjoys the most and he is now working towards achieving a Diploma in 12-Lead ECG Interpretation with the SCST (Society for Cardiological Science & Technology).

He has also recently been asked to go back to Sheffield Hallam as a qualified Paramedic to assist in teaching the ECG modules.
