Moderation and UCAS

November Moderation News

The Final Awards Board, where your grades will be finalised and confirmed, is scheduled to take place in the first half of December. We will email you once this has taken place to give you confirmation of your final grades. In the event of a grade change this will be communicated to you at this point.

Certificates

In January 2022, Ascentis will issue your certificate and transcript of achievement to us. The documents will then be checked and dispatched to you. Your certificate will come to you by registered 1st class post (meaning it will have to be signed for) to whatever address is listed on your account.

Please make sure the address listed on your account is accurate and the address you would like your certificate to be posted to. You can make any necessary changes by going to the 'my Account' tab on your account hub and selecting 'my Contact Details' from the drop down menu. This MUST be a UK address. If you do not check your details and your certificate is sent to the wrong address there will be a reissue fee to pay in order for us to release the certificate once it has returned to us.

UCAS:

Learners who have 6 graded credits and wish to apply to University through us should now be asking tutors for the buzzword.

Any student who wishes to have their form sent off before the 26th January 2022 equal consideration UCAS deadline MUST have completed and sent their application to their tutor by 12th January 2022

We strongly advise you complete your UCAS application as soon as possible, remember to use the advice on the UCAS application page in your learner account toolkit. Pleaser read the PowerPoint and watch the useful video on the Toolkit page.



Christmas Closure

DistanceLearningCentre.com's Winter Closure is from 5.00pm Friday 17th December 2021 until Tuesday 4th January 2022

During this time, your tutor will be unavailable for tutorials and will not be answering any phone calls or emails.

Your tutor will be able to provide you a maximum of 3 additional codes, you do not have to request all this additional work, please review your ILP and think about your plans for Christmas.

So for instance if you are on the materials you could request the assessment code and then the materials and assessment code for the next unit.

Please note - Student Services are unable to provide you with any passwords so you will need to ensure you have requested and received passwords from your tutor before we close.



Changes to SAQs and Updating Documents

We are in the process of reviewing all of the materials and in particular the SAQs to improve the links between them and your assessments. This is a lengthy process and likely to be ongoing for sometime, and as it is such a large project it isn't possible to give notice every time we make changes.

If we do change the SAQs and you are part way through the materials please don't worry. just continue from which ever SAQ you had got up to and if you do need an old version of any answer sheets please ask your tutor who will contact the Curriculum team.

However, if you do notice that the SAQs don't match in the materials, answer sheets and exemplar answer sheets then it is probably the case that we have updated the SAQs but your computer is still storing an older version in its cache (this is a place where your computer temporarily stores recently opened documents).

So to resolve the issue you need to clear your cache. The steps for doing this will be different depending on your browser, for most browsers this can be found through your history page. Here is a link to a handy website that gives instructions for most browsers.




