June Moderation-Important Points

June Moderation Deadline

If you want to moderate in June for a university start in September you need to have submitted all your assessments by Friday 27th May 2022 which means there are 8 weeks remaining.

You will need to plan your studies in order to complete on time remembering that the maximum number of assessments you can submit is **1 a week** (you can check the number of assessments you still have to complete by looking at your My Grades and Marksheets tab on your account).

Assessment Upload Allowance

You can only upload one new assessment each week, the system does not allow you to upload more assessments than this. Therefore it is very important when planning your ILP that you account for this maximum upload limit of one assessment per week. If there are 10 weeks left to moderation and you have more than 10 assessments left, you will not be able to upload all of the work needed for the moderation deadline. So you will need to either:

Speak to your tutor about changing your moderation date to the next moderation

Submit an <u>extenuating circumstances form</u> with evidence to request permission to exceed this assessment upload allowance in order to meet the moderation deadline.

Please note:

If your work is not **ready for marking**, your tutor will delete the submission and ask for amendments to be made to your work so that it is ready for marking.

Please follow the <u>ready for marking guidance</u> carefully and submit your amended assessment as soon as possible. Do note that you then cannot upload another assessment until 1 week from the date you upload the amended version.

If you have a **resubmission** your tutor will upload a marksheet giving you feedback on areas of your assessment which have not met the assessment criteria. You will need to complete additional work on your assessment and resubmit it. This resubmission does not count towards the one assessment per week (so you can upload a new assessment as well as a resubmission in the same week).

Easter Closure

We will be closed from Friday 11th April until Tuesday 19th April.

During this time, your tutor will be unavailable for tutorials and will not be answering any phone calls or emails.

However all your resources will still be available and you will still be able to upload SAQs and assessments onto your learner account. Therefore, all learners will need to make sure that they have the passwords for the 2 weeks whilst the tutors are on holiday.

Your tutor will be able to provide you with the assessment password for your current unit (if you are working through the materials), plus the materials password for the unit that you are due to study next, according to your Individual Learning Plan (ILP).

Or; If you are currently working on a unit assessment, the next materials and assessment password (according to your ILP) can be provided.



Have you got textbooks you no longer use?

When finishing a subject, you may have found certain textbooks to be really useful in your studies. If you find you no longer need a particular textbook anymore, you could consider selling iton.

A lot of our students have been selling their used textbooks on our Facebook group. This is a great way to find a new home for your unused textbooks.

Requesting Extensions

Requesting an extension when you cannot meet a deadline is vital to ensure your work is not capped at a pass.

If you are not able to meet a deadline, ensure you request an extension no later than the day the assessment is due.

Late submissions (including resubmissions) can be capped at a pass, so remember to keep track of when your work is due.






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
