November Moderation 2023



Well done to our students who have completed their course for November moderation!

If this is you, you must upload a **course evaluation form** before finishing. Please also read the **How to Guide on certification**. The course evaluation form and the How to Guide on certification are available in the 'Moderation dates' section of the 'My Courses' tab.

Certificates will be sent to us by the Awarding Body (Ascentis) some time in **January 2024**. Please check you have the correct address on your learner account.

Reminder about March Moderation 2024

No sooner does one moderation finish, the countdown for the next begins! The **March 2024** moderation deadline is **Friday 1st March.**

Moderation is when assessment work that has been marked by your tutor is checked by the Awarding Body, Ascentis. During this process, final grades are confirmed, and Diplomas are awarded. Certificates are then issued, and these should be with successful students in May.



If you are applying to university for 2024, we strongly advise you complete your UCAS application as soon as possible, remember to use the advice on the UCAS application page in your learner account toolkit.

Visit the <u>UCAS Hub</u> for some great workshops that will help you with your UCAS application. Remember to also visit the <u>UCAS Deadlines</u> page for all the key dates for your application.

Our official Facebook group is full of learners also studying with us, and who are applying to university. If you are applying as a student of DistanceLearningCentre.com you will need to request a **buzzword** from your tutor, which will identify your application as being linked to DistanceLearningCentre.com.

In order to access the DistanceLearningCentre.com buzzword you must have completed and passed 6 Level 3 credits.

If you are applying as a DistanceLearningCentre.com student, you tutor will write your UCAS reference, but before they can do this you will need to complete a 'tutor info form'.

Blended Learning Opportunities for Adult Nursing

Whether you'd like to provide care for adults in the community or in acute settings, the NMC regulated blended learning adult nursing degree (being offered by a number of universities throughout the UK) is designed to provide a great foundation for a career in health care.



Through blended learning, the course provides a flexible way to fit study around work and life, using mainly digital technologies, but still including practical and hands-on experience. Although the theoretical component of the degree programme is predominantly delivered online, students are expected to attend the university campus in their catchment area for a maximum total of 20 days per year of the course.

Your questions answered



This month's question is:

Why do we ask you to complete 6 credits of work and the tutor ref form before we issue the Buzzword for UCAS?

Our answer:

By giving you the UCAS Buzzword we are agreeing for you to link your application to us – and that we will provide a reference for you. Unless you have completed 6 credits of work it would be very difficult for us to provide any information to the universities about how you are doing academically – this is the minimum amount of work (usually the first two units) we need to be able to do this.

We ask you to complete the tutor reference form to give us any other information which we may not know about you (such as your work experience) so that we are also able to comment on this in your reference.

Whilst you can apply for UCAS independently it is worthwhile linking your application to us as we check your application and write your reference before it is sent to the universities.

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
