- You could ask the university if they would defer your place until next year or the next intake.
- If those options are not available, you can always apply to university for a start next year. You can apply through UCAS with us again. Contact your tutor when you are ready to start your application.

The best advice is to keep going with your course. Talk to your tutor about using your ILP effectively to plan your time moving forward. And remember....you have got this far already, success is just around the corner.



Your questions answered



This month's question is:

Why do we need to set deadlines for assessments?

Our answer:

It is a QAA regulation that all assessments have a deadline, and also that if deadlines are not met (without an agreed extension) that the grade recommended for the assessment is capped at a pass. This shows that students who have achieved higher grades on their diploma have submitted all their work on time (as well as demonstrating deeper understanding).

Working to deadlines is a key skill for university and doing this on your diploma helps you to develop this skill. If you do need more time to complete an assessment, you should ask your tutor for an extension before the deadline passes.
